Kidney Vetch	Anthyllis Vulneraria	Yellow flowers in 'crowded' head	Sun 7-15cm	May
Clustered bellflower	Campanula Glomerata	Cluster of handsome violet flowers	Sun 5-30cm	June
Cuckoo flower	Cardamine Pratensis	Lady's smock, lilac/white flowers	Moist situation 22-25cm	Apr - Jun
Greater Knapweed	Centaurea Scabiosa	Large 'raggy' purple flowers	Sun 30-60cm	July
Lesser Calamint	Clinopodium Nepeta	Downy grey leaves, small down-turned lilac flowers	Dry banks 30cm	Jul – Aug
Wild Basil	Clinopodium Vulgare	Circular clusters of largish pink/purple flowers	Sun 22-45cm	July
Maiden Pink	Dianthus Deltoides	Flowers pink freckled with darker paler spots	Sun 15-30cm	Jun - Aug
Dropwort	Filipendula Vulgaris	Finely cut leaflets in a basal rosette, cream coloured flowers open from pink buds	Sun 15-45cm	May - Aug
Lady's Bedstraw	Galium Verum	Flowers bright golden yellow, scent of new mown hay	Sun 15-30cm	July
Sweet Woodruff	Galium Odoratum	Whole plant is scented. Star like white flowers, shows up well in woodland	Shade 15-30cm	Apr - Jun
Hedge Cranesbill	Geranium Pyrenaecium	Very pretty with mauve flowers	Sun 22-45cm	May

Oxeye Daisy	Leucanthemum Vulgare	Large white petals, with a yellow centre	Sun 30-60cm	May
Birdsfoot Trefoil	Lotus Corniculatus	Small, bright yellow/orange mixture	Sun 15-22cm	May
Wood Forget-me-not	Myosotis Sylvatica	Pale blue woodland plant	Shade 30cm	Apr - Jun
Hoary Plantain	Plantago Media	Pale pinkish spikes with soft/fluffy petals, vanilla scented	Sun 15-30cm	May - Aug
Salad Burnet	Poterium Sanguisorba	Luscious green leaves with delicate pink/red flower heads. Smells of cucumber when crushed	Sun 30cm	May - Aug
Cowslip	Primula Veris	A rosette of low level leaves with fragrant deep yellow flowers	Damp, meadows 7-20cm	Apr - May
Wild Primrose	Primula Vulgaris	Pale yellow flower with deep yellow eye	Shade preferred 15cm	Mar - May
Self Heal	Prunella Vulgaris	Flowers violet/purple calyx	Sun 20cm	June
Large Pasque Flower	Pulsatilla Vulgaris	Rich violet sepals, golden anthers and silky hairs on the back. Silky plume of a seedhead	Sun 7-22cm	Apr - May
Small Scabious	Scabiosa Columbaria	Pale blue flowers	Sun 30cm	July
White Campion	Silene Alba	Pure white	Sun 90cm	May
Bladder Campion	Silene Vulgaris	Small white flowers with five-notched petals, with waxy leaves	Hedgebank 22-40cm	Jun - Aug
Honeysuckle	Lonicera Periclymenum	Cream flowers, sweet scent.	Woodland 2-5mtrs	Jun - Sep

Common Name	Latin Name	Description	Positioning/Height	Flowering Period
Bluebells	Hyacinthoides Non-Scripta	A favourite Spring flower. Fragrant blue-violet flowers	Light shade 30cm	Apr – Jun (plant in Autumn)
Anemone - wood	Anemone Nemerosa	Forms delicate white cover in wood and hedgebank	Light shade	Mar – May (plant in Autumn)
Wild Daffodils	Narcissus Pseudonarcissus	Nodding flowers, smaller than common garden daffodils	Light shade	Feb – Apr (plant in Autumn)
Snowdrops	Galanthus Nivalis	Small delicate flowers of distinct greenish white	Light shade	Jan – Mar (‘in the green’ – plant in Spring)
Aconites	Eranthis Hyemalis	Glossy leaves, yellow chalice shaped flowers	Light shade	Jan - Feb
Lesser Celandine	Renunculus Ficaria	Dark green heart-shaped leaves, bright yellow flowers	Bare, damp ground	Feb - May
Cuckoo Pint (Lords and Ladies)	Arum Maculatum	Yellow green berries (turning red – poisonous)	Woods and hedgerows 50cm	Apr - Aug
Snake's head Fritillary	Fritillaria Meleagris	Tall thin stems with down turned deep purple flower heads	Light, moist 30cm	Aug - Sep
Lily of the Valley	Convalleria Majalis	Luscious green foliage with delicate white flowers, sweetly scented	Shade 30cm	Apr - Jun

Common Name	Latin Name	Description	Positioning/Height	Flowering Period
Martagon Lily	Lilium Martagon	Tall stems, white or mauve flowers pretty lamp like shape	Shade 1mt 20cm	Jun – Jul
Ramsoms (wild garlic)	Allium Ursinum	Bright green leaves, delicate white spray of flowers	Damp woodlands/hedge banks 30 – 45cm	Apr - Jun
Soloman's Seal	Polygonatum	Graceful arching stems, green tipped white bell flowers	Shade 125cm	May - Jul
Star of Bethlehem	Ornithogalum Umbellatum	Beautiful star shaped white flowers	Meadows/grassy areas 30 – 60cm	Apr - May
Summer Snowflake	Leucojum Aestivum	Tall with small white bell shaped flowers	Prefers moist ground 90cm	Apr - May

List of Permissible Trees

These species only have been selected for our site

Common Name	Latin Name	Description	Extra Information
White Beam	Sorbus Aria	Member of the Rowan which will be coppiced. Cherry like fruits, drops leaves early.	Chalk tolerant
Hawthorn	Crataegus Monogyna	Good food source for birds, small green leaves, thorny stems, slow to establish	Flowers and fruits best in full sun
Hazel	Corylus Avellana	Good dormouse food source. Will be coppiced.	Bark is bronze in colour
Ash	Fraxinus Excelsior	Will be coppiced as part of the underwood.	Survives on poor soils where few other trees can grow
Wild Cherry	Prunus Avium	Short lived	In Autumn, leaves turn pink, orange or red before falling.
Crab Apple	Malus Sylvestris	Slow growing	Produces bright red fruits in Autumn – good winter food sources for birds
Silver Birch	Betula Pendula	Short lived	Grows quickly, provides habitat for native insects
Holly	Ilex Aquifolium	Evergreen, bright red berries	Tolerates deep shade
Guelder Rose	Viburnum Opulus	Fast growing shrub	Prefers damp areas but also grows in hederows and woods
Field Maple	Acer Campestre	Will be coppiced, yellow colour in Autumn	Tolerates shade
Spindle	Euonymous Europaea	Unusual geometric shaped pink berries	Common in ancient woods, hedges and chalk scrub
